Continuing the chain of documents from C R Gerig's father back to the valley of Hang in Bourg-Bruche.

Jacob's marriage record states he was born in Hang but his death record lists his birth place as Saint Marie-aux-Mines. We are fortunate that a state civil birth record in the municipality of Bourg-Bruche, where the valley of Hang is found, clarifies the matter. This record that I transcribed and posted below lists both Jacob's father and mother as residents of Hang. It proves they lived there. At the bottom of the record we find the only signature his father, Christian, left us.

On the record we can deduce the following:

- 1.) A son Joseph was born in 1799 at Hang. He either died as an infant or a child less than 4 years old. Christian Gerig and his wife Catherine Goldschmidt would have another son born at Hang on February of 1803 which they also named Joseph. There is no birth record for this second Joseph. His birth date is found on his marriage record.
- 2.) Child mortality was very high. Jacob himself named two sons Joseph in both 1836 and 1840. One died within 24 hours and the other lived only 9 days. Christian (Z) Gerig had 6 children. Three died as infants and one died at 6 years of age. Only C R Gerig and his sister Barbara lived to adulthood and came to America.
- 3.) Joseph was an important name to pass on in this Gerig family. Even Jean Gerig who moved with his brother Christian Gerig II to Hang in 1774 had a son named Joseph. Perhaps they had a grandfather or uncle named Joseph.
- 4.) Jacob's father created a unique signature for himself. He was one of three Christian Gerigs that lived at Hang. His father, a cousin and himself. He places a special "m" mark under his first name. Only he knows what that meant. He writes with so much ink it soaks through the paper to the other side.
